We are pleased to announce open enrollment for the Fall 2021 term of Warden's School of Instruction. During this period all Master Masons, who are eligible to participate:

Must have satisfactorily completed the Masonic School of Instruction

- 1. Must be current financially, active by regular attendance and support
- 2. Must have the recommendation of their respective lodges under the signature of their Blue Lodge Worshipful Master

To accommodate for COVID protocols and concerns, instruction will be facilitated primarily via electronic media (email & teleconference). Additionally, on-site @ Temple class sessions will be scheduled **as needed** for the second Saturdays of the month, September – December 2021basis. Un-remediated absence or lack of participation (ex. failure to satisfactorily complete lesson review materials) will constitute grounds for dismissal.

Dress Code: Business Casual (White Polo Shirt and Black Pants) or Masonic attire for every onsite assembly however, there will be an allowance made for brethren coming directly from work. On-site classes are anticipated to be approximately 75-90 minutes in length. Dues: are \$25 and due on or before October 9, 2021.

SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Personal Preparedness Checklist

Emergency preparedness is not just a professional responsibility, emergency preparedness is also essential to your daily life outside of work. This Personal Preparedness Checklist provides suggestions and references to be used in order to prepare for such situations. Look through this checklist and identify how many of these steps you have taken:

- * For information about emergency preparedness, see www.ready.gov.
- * Sign up for emergency alerts at www.capitalert.gov.
- * Visit www.weather.gov/nwr/ for information on the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Weather Radio All Hazards, a nationwide network of radio stations broadcasting continuous weather information directly from the nearest National Weather Service.
- * Know two evacuation routes from work and where to assemble outside.
- * Post the emergency numbers for law enforcement or security personnel next to your phone at work and home, and program them into your cell phone.
- * Visit your local city or county emergency management website for local information.
- * Know alternate routes home and prepare to walk or take public transportation.
- * Pick two family meeting spots: one right outside your home and one outside your neighborhood. Ensure each family member has a plan to get to your meeting spots.
- * Choose an out-of-town friend or relative that all family members will contact if separated.
- * Be sure all family members know how to send a cell phone text message.
- * Prepare a family emergency contact list with the numbers and e-mail addresses for friends, neighbors, babysitters, caregivers, and schools.
- * Ask about the emergency plans in place at the schools, daycare centers, or assisted living centers that you visit or use.
- * Build a kit of basic emergency supplies for home and work.
- * Keep basic emergency supplies in your car.
- * Make sure important documents, including medical and financial records, will be available in an emergency. Take pictures or a video of your home and your belongings. Keep all of these items in a safe place where you can access them in an emergency. Think about saving them to your phone, removable media you take with you, or the cloud.
